Jeffrey Prater, Professor Emeritus of Music at Iowa State University, composed "Winter Holidays in the Gardens" for a luncheon presentation featuring the Stanton Memorial Carillon that took place at ISU's Reiman Gardens. The presentation took place in the main building of the Gardens in December 2010. "Winter Holidays in the Gardens" was performed remotely from the central campus by University Carillonneur Tin-Shi Tam. The audience at the Gardens heard the music via the internet and loudspeaker connections. The work, subtitled "A Triptych", is in three movements that celebrate the winter holidays. The two outer movements are fast and bright, and the middle movement is slow and melancholic.
