Toni Raats was born in 1960 and raised in Roosendaal, a small town in the south of the Netherlands near the Belgian border. He studied carillon at the Royal Carillon School in Mechelen, Belgium, under the tutelage of Carlo van Ulft, Jo Haazen, Eddy Mariën, and Geert D'Hollander. Since graduating in 1998, he has been giving annual concerts in the Netherlands and Belgium. In 2012, Toni made a concert tour in the USA and Canada. Most recently, in 2023, he performed on the carillon of the Royal Palace of Mafra near Lisbon, Portugal.

He is currently a freelance carillon musician based in Halsteren.

In 2010, Toni was appointed as the city carillonneur of Roosendaal. He plays every Monday during market hours, and in the summer, he hosts six evening concerts. His goal is to bring the music of the bells closer to the community. Since 2022, Toni can be followed worldwide on the YouTube channel "carillonsintjanroosendaal". He strives to create cultural connections with various associations, from classical music to carnival celebrations.

To commemorate the 50th anniversary of the carillon and the 750th anniversary of the city of Roosendaal, he initiated various events that combined song, dance, and drama. Besides his carillon work, Toni is an organist for the St. Alfonsus choir and the cantors at Our Lady's Church in Roosendaal. He also accompanies solo singers and the ladies' ensemble "Vivace", and he plays piano with the Delta Quintet and the "Serenado" trio.

Music runs in Toni's family; he is the third generation on his mother's side (Family Los). Interestingly, all family members share the same first name, Antony (Toon or Toni). In Dutch, the word "toon" means both "tone" and "note," highlighting the musical connection.

Beyond his musical pursuits, Toni works as a coach and social worker in corporate settings. He helps individuals deal with conflicts, trauma, stress, burnout, and organizational changes. His experience in music enriches this work, as conversations often revolve around rhythm, improvisation, structure, intonation, and, most importantly, active listening to foster solutions.
